Dr. Ross Prager is an intensivist at LHSC with an interest in critical care ultrasound and hemodynamic phenotyping of critically ill patients. He is the PI of an international study investigating venous congestion in septic shock using Doppler (Andromeda-VEXUS). He is also passionate about education, knowledge translation, and leveraging social media as a platform to amplify dissemination and uptake of new research.
