The Master of Public Health (MPH) Program will place you at the intersection of leadership, policy and sustainability as you address the determinants of health in Canada and beyond. The MPH Program is a 12-month, full-time program employing case-based and team-based learning. With real public health issues as the foundation of your learning, you will be immersed in some of the most significant and complex public health crises that our country and planet have experienced. Students will learn about public health in a team-based setting where they practice decision-making skills under pressure.

With a special focus on public health issues experienced in urban and rural settings, Indigenous populations across Canada and international populations, this Program will help you foster a special skill set to better understand and assess health problems and develop appropriate solutions for various communities.

A 12-week practicum, various networking opportunities with public health practitioners, and the unique opportunity to learn from an integrated, interdisciplinary faculty will further enhance your in-class, small group and Independent learning.

The MPH Program is accredited by the Council on Education for Public Health.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

- A four-year undergraduate degree with a minimum 70% (Canadian equivalency) in the past two years of study
- Demonstrated awareness and interest of the public health profession's role in identifying and solving complex health problems (through work, volunteering, etc.)
- Demonstrated English language proficiency (TOEFL, IELTS) if you have not studied at the university level for at least two years in an English speaking country (Canada, United States, Australia, New Zealand, United Kingdom and Nigeria)
- Recommended: Successfully completed undergraduate statistics course with a minimum 70% (Canadian equivalency) within the last five years

- Emphasis on development and application of skills in team-based problem solving and decision making
- 12-week practicum at local, national, and international sites
