Internal Reviews

Our 2023-2025 Internal Review cycle began – internal reviews are required for all programs a minimum of once per accreditation cycle. Our external accreditation will be in the fall of 2027 for PGME, Royal College programs (including AFC programs), and our CFPC Family Medicine and Enhanced Skills programs.

Of note – some programs will have an additional internal review during the cycle to ensure the identified areas for improvement have been addressed.

Thank you to our faculty and resident survey teams. Thank you also to the Internal Review Subcommittee (Chaired by Dr. Volker Hocke) for their review of the survey reports and program progress reports.

We have a lot more programs scheduled for reviews in 2024 – please consider being a member of a survey team.



Changes that were made to our internal review process in 2023 include:

- Sending the draft survey reports to programs for an 'Errors of Fact' response which mirrors the external review accreditation process. This also provides programs with a draft report to review early in the process.
- Update of the survey report which is being modified further to more closely mirror an external report.
- Program resources were developed, such as a document checklist, to assist with survey preparation.
- The Resident Report template was updated to highlight questions about learning environment, resident safety, and any concerns with respect to discrimination or racism. A question about industry sponsored events was also added to help identify any breaches of the Schulich Western Conflict of Interest Policy.
- A Qualtrics survey was developed and is sent to individual program residents prior to an internal review to allow the opportunity for confidential information to be provided to our survey teams.
- Progress report review by the Internal Review Subcommittee is incorporated.
- Development of additional PGME spreadsheets and tracking documentation to ensure program follow-up.

For 2024, an Internal Review Handbook is being developed to ensure all resources are in one place and easily available for programs and survey teams.

Resident Allocation and Postgraduate Medical Expansion

The Resident Allocation Subcommittee Terms of Reference were revised to reflect the increase in PGY1 allocations as part of the MOH Medical Education Expansion.

Our Resident Allocation Committee met and developed a plan for the 2024 PGY1 allocation. For PGY1 2023 and 2024, the 25 additional positions (relative to the 2022 match) allocated for the medical education expansion were:

- 1 FM Enhanced Skill (PGY3)
- 9 Family Medicine (2 for 2023 and 7 for 2024)
- 1 Physical Medicine and Rehabilitation
- 5 Psychiatry (3 London, 2 Windsor)
- 3 Internal Medicine (2 allocated to Windsor)
- 1 Orthopedics
- 1 Pediatrics
- 1 Diagnostic and Molecular Pathology (Anatomic Pathology)
- 2 Anesthesia
- 1 Emergency Medicine
