



For course managers, here are a few highlights before September rolls around. First, 4th-year course registration will occur between July 8 and July 12. Undoubtedly, students will contact you wanting special permission due to missing prerequisites or time conflicts. Please watch for an email from Angela with details on how to handle those.

As you know, Western is implementing a new absence policy this year, where students can report one absence per term per course without any documentation. We are working on some messaging that will help you plan your assessments and will have that sent out soon.

Hopefully, most of you have navigated our new Brightspace learning management system by now and started setting up your site if you have a first-semester course. We will set an internal deadline of **Tuesday**, **August 6th**, for you to complete your site to give us time to review and make sure all sites are functional for launch by August 30<sup>th</sup>.

The new course syllabus template has been sent out. Please use that template this year, as some significant changes have been implemented. If you manage a first-semester course, please send your completed course syllabus to Michele Grigg by **Tuesday, August 6th**, at the latest, for review.

For 4980 supervisors, please mark **Friday, September 6th from noon to 2 PM** in your calendar for Phys/Pharm 4980 interview day. A welcome reception will follow — stay tuned for details.

IQAP (Institutional Quality Assurance Process) review (undergrad): Work is ongoing for the IQAP review that will be submitted in October 2025. We have a work-study student who is currently collecting alumni information, focus groups with 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> year students have been completed, and we are preparing to survey alumni from our program who have graduated in the past 8 years.

#### **Graduate Studies Update**

We are now in the summer term, so a quick reminder for graduate students and supervisors to take into account wellness and vacation time, as mentioned in the Senate Policy from May 17, 2024:

Full-time graduate students in research-based programs are expected to be active in their program for all three terms of the university year, as specified in Section 2. While engaging in their program, we recognize that personal time (i.e. time away from studies) is beneficial for student health, well-being and academic achievement. It is acceptable and expected that Supervisors, Supervisory Committee Members and Graduate Chairs will discuss expectations around students' study and research schedules; they will mentor students and support their need for time off and their pursuit of work/life balance. Time away from studies must take into account the impact on timely progression and the impact on research and other responsibilities.

It is expected that students devote a reasonable number of hours each weekday to study and to research. It is acceptable for students to take days off. In making these time management decisions, it is expected that students will learn to discern when time away from studies supports academic productivity, and when it undermines timely progression.

In addition to the above, students are entitled to be away from their studies and research responsibilities during:

- the closing of the University from late December until early January
- statutory holidays when the University is closed
- religious holidays in accordance with University policy

Graduate students are also entitled to at least two weeks of vacation time from their studies per year.

### Research Committee Update

A big thank you to Dr. Peter Stathopulos as he steps down as Chair of the Research Committee. Peter made exceptional contributions to the Research Committee during his term as Chair, expanding the lunch and learn sessions, obtaining external grant funding for the departmental core facility and leading several other initiatives that have enhanced research capacity in our department. Dr. Rithwik Ramachandran will take over as Research Committee Chair on July 1st, 2024.

Stevenson's Distinguished Lecture and Research Day:

On Thursday June 20th, our department celebrated the many accomplishments and milestones of various members of the department and the changes in leadership across several departmental committees.


